GARDEN TO GARDEN Lesson 1

I. The Bible is Divine Revelation About God: Genesis 1:1-3; 2 Peter 1:20-21

The Bible is not an end in itself, but a means to bring men to an intimate and satisfying knowledge of God, that they may enter into Him, that they may delight in His Presence, may taste and know the inner sweetness of the very God Himself in the core and center of their hearts. – A. W. Tozer

God the Father is the giver of Holy Scripture; God the Son is the theme of Holy Scripture; and God the Spirit is the author, authenticator, and interpreter of Holy Scripture. – J.I. Packer

II. The Bible Reveals the Redemption Story in Four Parts: Eden, Exile, Emmanuel, Eternity

One **evidence that the Bible is truly God's Word** is seen in its unity. Even though it is really sixty-six individual books, written on three continents, in three different languages, over a period of approximately 1500 years, by more than 40 authors who came from many walks of life, the Bible remains one unified book from beginning to end without contradiction. This unity is unique from all other books and is evidence of the divine origin of the words which God moved men to record.

III. The Bible Reveals Humanity Designed by God and For Relationship with God

Shalom: is a Hebrew noun that refers to the wholeness, perfection, prosperity, and peace of God's creation. When He created the world, He webbed all things together with Him in perfect harmony, delight and peace. Genesis says that God walked in the Garden of Eden during the cool of day.

IV. The Bible Reveals What Vandalized Our World: Genesis 2:2-9; Genesis 3

With the fall, shalom was vandalized and perverted. Adam and Eve broke the natural order of placing God first when they ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Sin, pain and selfishness have taken over God's creation; natural disasters plague the world and creation no longer has direct communication with God. After the fall, when Adam and Eve heard God walking in the garden, they no longer walked with Him. Instead, they hid from Him in their shame.

V. The Bible Reveals the Way Back to the Tree of Life

Access Denied Genesis 3:22-24

Access Offered John 14:6; John 3;16; Romans 6:23

"When man lost the way to the tree of life, he lost his way back into God's presence. Although God provided alternative, partial ways back—through sacrifice, prayer, and especially through the tabernacle and temple—the way was never completely restored, because man was not yet fit to enter God's presence as he was in the beginning. Only in Christ, the final and perfect Way, could man—any man, any woman—go all the way back to God and stand in God's presence. By His atonement, Christ, the way, makes us fit for God and brings us as near to God as He is Himself."

Access Regained Revelation 2:7; Revelation 22:1-22

"In Eden, the tree of life appears to have been a source of ongoing physical life. The presence of the tree of life suggests a supernatural provision of life as Adam and Eve ate the fruit their Creator provided. Adam and Eve were designed to live forever, but to do so they likely needed to eat from the tree of life. Once they sinned, they were banned from the Garden, separated from the tree, and subject to physical death, just as they had experienced spiritual death. Since Eden, death has reigned throughout history. But on the New Earth, our access to the tree of life is forever restored." - Randy Alcorn, Heaven
